Presidential Guest Speaker Mary I. O'Connor, MD

Co-Founder & Chief Medical Officer, Vori Health and Professor Emerita of Orthopaedics, Mayo Clinic

Dr. Mary I. O'Connor will be the WOA 2025 Presidential Guest Speaker. A nationally recognized leader who has championed diversity in medicine, surgery and orthopedics, Dr. O'Connor is Professor Emerita of Orthopedics at Mayo Clinic, as well as past Professor of Orthopedics and Rehabilitation at Yale School of Medicine. She is Co-Founder and Chief Medical Officer of Vori Health, an award-winning, nationwide, virtual specialty medical practice designed to treat musculoskeletal pain more effectively.

After competing as a U.S. Olympic rower, Dr. O'Connor completed her orthopedic residency and fellowship in orthopedic oncology at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN, during a time when few women were accepted into training programs. She was invited to join the staff at Mayo Clinic in Florida and wore many leadership hats throughout the organization. In 2015, Dr. O'Connor was named the inaugural director of the Center for Musculoskeletal Care at Yale School of Medicine and Yale New Haven Health. In 2021, she transitioned from academic medicine to entre-preneurship as co-founder of Vori Health.

Dr. O'Connor has accomplished many "firsts." She was the first female member of the Musculoskeletal Tumor Society (MSTS), the International Society of Limb Salvage (ISOLS), the American Association of Hip and Knee Surgeons (AAHKS) and the first female surgeon in The Knee Society. She has also served as president of the Association of Bone and Joint Surgeons (ABJS), AAHKS, ISOLS, MSTS and the Ruth Jackson Orthopaedic Society (RJOS). She is a former member of the Advisory Committee on Research on Women's Health at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD and is previous chair of the AAOS Women's Health Issues Advisory Board and the AAOS Diversity Advisory Board.



Howard Steel Lecturer Damon West

Best Selling Author, Keynote Speaker, Philanthropist and College Professor

The WOA is pleased to have Damon West as the Howard Steel Lecturer for our 89th Annual Meeting.

At 20 years old, Damon was a Division 1 starting quarterback at the University of North Texas, when he suffered a career ending injury and turned to hardcore drugs to cope with disappointments of life.

After graduation, he worked in the United States Congress and trained to be a stockbroker for United Bank of Switzerland (UBS), where he was introduced to methamphetamines and became instantly hooked—forever changing the lives of so many innocent people by the choices he made in order to feed his instaiable meth habit.

After a fateful discussion during his incarceration with a seasoned convict, Damon had a spiritual awakening. He learned that, like a coffee bean changing with the application of heat and pressure, he was capable of changing the environment around him. Armed with a program of recovery, a renewed faith, and a miraculous second chance at life, Damon emerged from over seven years of prison a changed man.

On parole in Texas until 2073, his story is one of hope, redemption, grit and the resilience of the Human spirit.
